ANNOUNCEMENTS

- As we feel the oppressive extremes of the summer season, *let us be ever more mindful of the church's dress code*. The heat tests us all, yet a little extra care keeps immodesty from slipping in unnoticed.
- All adult parishioners are asked to complete the church's **new registration form**, available at the entrances. Though it may seem like a formality, your response is a *great* help to Father's ministry. Without it, he will need to follow up with parishioners individually—a very time-consuming task.
- The seminary newsletter for the month of May is available at the entrances.
- Next Sunday, **June 21st**, we will have the honor of hosting **His Excellency, Bishop Sanborn**, together with several **Sisters of St. Thomas Aquinas**, who serve with the Roman Catholic Institute at Queen of All Saints Academy in Brooksville, FL.
 - The purpose of their visit is *to explore with us the possibility of establishing a Traditional Catholic school in our area*—perhaps

beginning as a satellite school. This is still a very early step, but an exciting one nonetheless.

- After Mass, the Sisters will give a short presentation downstairs, followed by a Q&A session. They will speak about the curriculum, their approach to teaching, administration, and financial aid.
- I warmly encourage *as many of our families as possible* to attend, along with anyone else who may be interested. And please, spread the word: invite other families in the area who might welcome this opportunity. The Sisters already enjoy a wonderful reputation for their fruitful work of mercy.
- The church's backlog of Mass stipends has now been taken up by Father. (The intentions are displayed in the Weekly Ordo.)
 - **Stipends:** At the request of Bishop Sanborn, and so that the customary offering may be uniform among priests at RCI churches, the stipend for a Mass intention will be \$30 going forward (formerly \$25).

A NOTE TO NEWCOMERS

Welcome to the traditional Latin Mass, and to the unchanged Catholic Faith. The priests and parishioners of Sacred Heart Church reject the changes of Vatican II. They want to preserve the Roman Catholic Faith by maintaining everything which was taught and done by the Church prior to Vatican II. In order to receive the sacraments here, it is therefore necessary that you attend exclusively the traditional Latin Mass, and avoid the New Mass, the reformed sacraments, as well as any Masses which are offered in union with the Vatican II hierarchy. *Those wishing to receive the Sacraments here regularly are kindly asked to speak with the priest beforehand regarding their sacramental situation.*

DRESS CODE

For Men: Jacket and tie on *Sundays* and *holy days of obligation*. No earrings. No shorts.

For Women: A dress or skirt is required; no pants or shorts. The skirt must at least cover the knee, and should not be tight or otherwise revealing in any way. Immodest slits are forbidden. *Clothing should be loose and not formfitting.* A head covering is also required. See-through blouses are forbidden, as well as clothing which is low-cut either in front or in back.

For Everyone: No tennis shoes, sandals, clogs, flip-flops, or jeans, *even on weekdays.* No piercings. Clothing with writing on it (e.g., sweatshirts or jackets) is also forbidden. *Anyone in tight, provocative, or otherwise revealing attire will not be permitted to enter the church.*

DOCTRINAL NOTICE

Anyone who adheres to the doctrines of Fr. Feeney is barred from receiving the sacraments in this church. In the 1940s, Fr. Leonard Feeney, S.J., promoted the heresy that there was no such thing as baptism of blood or baptism of desire. Fr. Feeney's teaching is contrary to the universal ordinary magisterium of the Catholic Church. It was condemned in 1949 by the Holy Office. All Catholics are bound under pain of mortal sin to give assent to the teachings of the Holy Office. A number of lay Catholics mistakenly adhere to this heresy, falsely thinking that it is the teaching of the Catholic Church.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Baptisms are by appointment. **Godparents** must be practicing Catholics in good standing who reject the changes of Vatican II. If you are contemplating **Matrimony**, please contact the priest before making any other arrangements, e.g., purchase of gowns or rental of halls. When making arrangements for **funerals**, please contact the priest *before* contacting the funeral director.

SAINT'S QUOTE

The perfume of penitence reaches even to the supernal mansions of the blessed above, so that as Truth Itself testifies, "There shall be joy amongst the angels of God over one sinner doing penance." Rejoice, therefore, ye penitents! Be comforted, ye that are fearful!
